

Modern Foreign Language – French Overview 2023-24

Children are taught phonemes and core vocabulary at the start of each yearly unit which moves onto essential learning within key topics to be able to understand and speak French whilst being aware of grammatical features. Each journey is progressive but repetitive so that prior learning is not lost, but built upon. Children are supported to listen, speak, read and write in French. Children are given application opportunities through roleplay, interactive games, songs and grammar challenges. Each year, our language learning will *progress as the children are exposed to more French where more complex sentences and aspects of grammar will be taught.
